

Classification of Flammable and Combustible Liquids

Flammable Liquid:

A liquid having a flash point below 100°F and having a vapor pressure not exceeding 40 pisa (2.72 ATM).

Class I Flammable Liquids have flash points below 100°F and are subdivided as follows:

Class I-A Liquids:

Have a flash point below 73°F and a boiling point below 100°F.

Class I-B Liquids:

Have a flash point below 73°F and a boiling point at or above 100°F.

Class I-C Liquids:

Have a flash point at or above 73°F and below 100°F.

Combustible Liquid:

A liquid having a flash point at or above 100°F. Combustible liquids are subdivided as follows:

Class II Liquids:

Have flash points at or above 100°F and below 140°F.

Class III-A Liquids:

Have flash points at or above 140°F and below 200°F.

Class III-B Liquids:

Have flash points at or above 200°F.
